The regular meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Haledon took place on May 26, 2016 at 7:28PM in the Council Chambers of the Haledon Municipal Complex located at 510 Belmont Avenue, Haledon, New Jersey.

This meeting was called pursuant to the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Law. Notice of this meeting was included in a notice sent to the North Jersey Herald & the Record on January 8, 2016 posted on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building on January 8, 2016 and has remained continuously posted as the required notices under the Statute. PUBLIC HEARING

Joseph Moore, 9 Bushmann Ave. - the issue with parking due to The Shepherd and The Knucklehead continues. We have to park two blocks away from our houses. Still requesting permit parking and handicap permit parking for the area of John Ryle St. /Bushmann Ave. The Shepherd and The Knucklehead are requesting 20 parking spots for their employees but they do not need them.

Eddie Yagen, 15 Bushmann Ave. - was a resident for 15 years. There is no resolution to this ongoing problem with The Shepherd and The Knucklehead. Called the Police Department on Sunday around 1:30am due to the loud noise and drinking in The Shepherd and The Knucklehead parking lot. A Police Officer was dispatched to the location and would like to know if a summons was issued. I see Captain Lindberg patrolling on Saturday but I don't see patrol on Sundays. Requested Police presence in the area of John Ryle St. / Bushmann on Sunday as well. Attended the meeting due to Joseph Moore's request but will contact the media if progress is not made.

Birdy- Understand what people are going through. A kid hit me with a stone. This is a community issue.

GOVERNING BODY RESPONSES

Council President Mounir Almaita- why does The Shepherd and The Knucklehead need 20 parking spots? We are restricted by the law and there is a process that needs to be followed to handle this matter in the right way. A survey needs made up and distributed to the residents. If permit parking is not free, some residents do not want to pay. Requested Lt. Guzman to look into who the Officer was that went on the call and if a summons was issued.

Lieutenant Guzman- I will do the research on who went on the call and if a summons was issued. Explained the process the Officer follows once he answers the call, he/she has their discretion how a situation is handled. If the matter is serious, the Officer can file a complaint against The Shepherd and The Knucklehead. We have been patrolling and monitoring the area.

Councilman Islam Sery- is the Police Department patrolling Friday, Saturday and Sunday?

Lieutenant Guzman- just this weekend (Memorial Day weekend).

Councilman Islam Sery- can Sunday be covered and the Special Police Patrol that day as well?

Joseph Moore- we don't like to come to the meetings to create issues, but we do need the noise and parking issues resolved.

Councilman Islam Sery- the issue is not you coming to the meeting that is part of why the meetings are held.

Lieutenant Guzman- the calls that come in regarding The Shepherd and The Knucklehead are not a lot.

Councilman Michael Johnson- this issue with The Shepherd and The Knucklehead has been tolerated for way too long- 2 years? We have discussed this so many times, Lt. Guzman we will enforce zero tolerance with the non-compliances of The Shepherd and The Knucklehead. Issue summons for each violation because the owner was already spoken to. Our residents shouldn't be wondering if coming to the Mayor and Council meetings are worthwhile or not.

Eddie Yagen- owner of The Shepherd and The Knucklehead hit a parked car and never called to make a police report. If he behaves in this manner, how will the employees behave?

Councilman Michael Johnson- it is a family oriented business. If they request 20 parking spaces it is fine, but loud noises at 1, 2, and 3 am is a nuisance and it will not be tolerated. Call the Police Department so an officer is dispatched every time there is loud noise coming from The Shepherd and The Knucklehead.

Council President Mounir Almaita- if possible would like the Police Department to patrol the area of Leonard Drive and report findings to the Public Safety Committee.

Code Enforcer John Lindberg- issued summonses for unregistered vehicles on Leonard Drive.
