### **DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS AND DISCUSSION**

ENGINEER'S REPORT – ALAIMO ENGINEERING – Allan Susen reviewed some engineering points.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT – Allan Susen read his report and mentioned the Body worn camera grant.

Mayor Stampone explained Haledon is one of 106 cities nationwide that received the grant.

### **FINANCE**

1. Budget requests and Capital Budget requests are due in my office December 2<sup>nd</sup>.

### **ADMINISTRATION**

1. The Security Camera bid required an addendum resulting in a change to the bid acceptance date. The new bid opening date is December 21<sup>st</sup>.
2. Proposals for 2017 Professional Services were received December 6<sup>th</sup>. The proposals require review and scoring prior to making the appointments usually scheduled for action at the Reorganization meeting.
3. Alaimo is continuing its investigation into options regarding the Borough's sanitary sewer connection with Paterson.
4. We have begun preparations for the annual Reorganization meeting. The meeting agenda draft was prepared and a revision will be distributed next week.
5. I met with Donna Huber, Passaic County Municipal Alliance Coordinator; to review the Municipal Alliance program. She is willing to assist the Borough in reorganizing. On tonight's agenda is a resolution naming individuals to the Municipal Alliance.

### **CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS**

1. The John Street/Geyer Street project received a grant extension, enabling the work to be completed by June 30, 2017.
2. Improvements to Various Streets – A notice to proceed was issued October 3, 2016. Ford Road is part of this project and work is progressing. Drainage improvements are complete and curb installation is complete. A base course of asphalt will be installed December 9<sup>th</sup> with final paving and restorations scheduled for Spring 2017.
3. Belmont Square – preliminary plans are complete following a meeting I had with Councilman Martinez and Nordan Murphy. A follow up meeting is needed to review plan revisions following Nordan Murphy's meeting with the Passaic County Planning & Economic Development office. When plans are finalized, Nordan will schedule a public presentation.

WHEREAS, the Administration of Haledon Public School and Manchester Regional High School are requesting the Borough of Haledon remove election poll sites from school property; and

WHEREAS, the reasons for requesting the change are “safety and security” of students and major inconvenience of physical education classes and recess activities being displaced; and

WHEREAS, the safety of students is of utmost importance and certainly is a priority; and

WHEREAS, it is also important that in our efforts to provide adequate security we do not undermine voting access and voter rights by creating obstacles for voters; and

WHEREAS, the selection of polling locations is the responsibility of the Haledon Municipal Clerk in consultation with the Passaic County Board of Elections; and

WHEREAS, polling sites should be easily accessible and within the confines of the election districts they represent; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 19:8-2 establishes the selection process of polling locations providing that preference in locations shall be given to schools and public buildings where space shall be made available by the authorities in charge; and

WHEREAS, additionally in no case shall the authorities in charge of a public school or other public building deny the request of the county board of elections for the use, as a polling place, of any building they own or lease; and

WHEREAS, when logistical problems exist, school authorities and the board of elections should discuss ways to remedy the issue; and

WHEREAS, in consideration of the careful review of all aspects involved in the voting process including but not limited to voter access, voter rights, removal of obstacles to the voting process, proximity to election districts, and requirements under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA); the Municipal Clerk of the Borough of Haledon does not recommend relocation of polling sites from the Haledon Public School and Manchester Regional High School; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Clerk is willing to open a dialogue to improve any condition at the schools that may be considered a security breach or safety issue;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Governing Body of the Borough of Haledon hereby concurs with the conclusion of the Municipal Clerk to not relocate polling locations in consideration of the election process and voter rights; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Governing Body hereby requests the Municipal Clerk to address issues of concern with Haledon Public School and Manchester Regional High School authorities regarding traffic and safety on Election Day within the school properties.
